CRITIC'S CORNER MORGAN 30

PROS

- Wide sidedecks allow easy passage fore and aft.
- Clear view from the helm.
- End-boom mainsheet keeps load where it belongs.
- Keel-stepped mast reinforces rig.
- Double lifelines (optional) add security.

CONS

- Low sill exposes companionway to downflooding.
- Big masthead genoa not well-suited for quick tacks.
- Roller-furling boom more trouble than it is worth.
- Molded foredeck hatch not as watertight as a gasketed aluminum-frame, acrylic or Lexan hatch.





Most of the shortcomings of the Morgan 30 are typical of boats of its era and can be remedied by retrofitting with new hardware and some modifications..
