1. Warning, read manual before starting.
2. The outboard lift edge of the valve handle serves as the indicator, so they are in the off position.
3. It indicates the sight glass for oil level.
4. This "milk can" signifies a 5-gallon fuel tank that he down-ward sloping line indicates fuel flowing, correct.
5. He's clearly carrying the engine with the propeller up. When the fuel is off, it's time to carry the Suzuki like this.
